



Berwick Bridge 400: Celebrating the bridge designed to serve Spittal, Tweedmouth and Berwick and link two kingdoms.

A programme of free activities, entertainment and experiences for all the family is planned for the weekend 3rd and 4th August between 10am and 4pm to celebrate the 400th anniversary of the opening of Berwick Bridge.

The programme begins 10am on 3rd August on the riverside green in West End, Tweedmouth with The Lord Lieutenant of Northumberland, Dr

Caroline Pryer. Thursdays Singers will perform "Berwick Bridge's Birthday Song", composed by Alison Coates, and the ceremony will end with the Blessing of the Bridge. A commemorative wreath of flowers representing England and Scotland will then be cast from the bridge into the waters of the Tweed and a Bridge plaque unveiled.

Berwick's historic Quayside will host 17thC re-enactments and The Maltings Youth Theatre will tell the story of the building and opening of the Bridge. Berwick Archivist Linda Bankier will lead family-friendly history and story walks across the Bridge. There will also be music representing both sides of the Border with performances by Berwick Pipe Band and Spittal Northumbrian Pipers.

A Quayside market on Sunday 4th, street food traders and a wide selection of crafts, artisan food and drink stalls.

During the weekend, a marquee on the green in West End will host performances by local musicians and singers, jazz, blues, baroque music and choral singing, and the Shindiggers special needs drumming band.

On both days the Queen's Garden in Tweedmouth will host creative arts workshops with Berwick Bridge 400 artist in residence Annie Lord and artisan papermaking experiences with Lucy Baxandall using locally sourced materials from around Berwick Bridge. Berwick Museum and Art Gallery with artist Claire Beattie will be offering the opportunity to try your hand at Gyutaku, the ancient Japanese fishermen's skill of "fish printing".

Sunday 4th August the "Time bandits" and "The Guilde" will welcome visitors to their 17thC encampment on Palace Green, to learn about life in Berwick when our Bridge was built. There will also be replica 17thC weapons on the fortifications, beside Wellington Terrace.



Berwick Civic Society 2024 exhibition in the Main Guard is Berwick's Bridges. Describing how the Bridge was built and the recent restoration by Northumberland County Council, entry free of charge 11.00am to 4.00pm daily (except Wednesdays) until 30th September.


