Yet another year is drawing to a close and to use a well known saying 'Where has all the time gone!'

The main thing that has dominated Spittal Improvement Trust's (SIT) year is of course the Spittal Community Centre & Hall (SCC). We will have been using the building for two years at the end of next month and, as we are all volunteers who have never before been involved in such an enterprise, we are pleased at the way the SCC has been steadily attracting more groups using the building. We have quite a few groups who are with us throughout the year, for which we are grateful to, and some that come for perhaps just one time only. All of whom keep us in a good position to continue. However, we cannot get complacent about what it takes to keep the SCC going. The housekeeping side of things are currently being carried out mainly by committee members. This means that someone is checking the building over every day of the week.

There are still potential possibilities for the use of the SCC that we have not had the time, or volunteers, to put in place. This includes a café; we already have a book library that is bursting with books for those that want to just sit and read. There are also board games and jigsaw puzzles. We have previously reported in this newsletter the problems being encountered with the winding mechanism of the clock located in the SCC. Berwick Preservation Trust were approached to see if any grants would be available to us for replacing the existing mechanism for an automated system. Following a meeting at the SCC, the Preservation Trust have agreed to offer a grant to cover the shortfall in monies raised to date which will now enable us to accept the quotation from Smiths of Derby, who have been maintaining the clock for many years and are also a well-known clock restoration company. Spittal Improvement Trust would like to thank the Berwick Preservation Trust for this offer, especially as the neighbours are missing the hourly chimes! We would also like to thank the Church Synod, and for those who donated online, for their donations, without which we could not have continued. It will take some time to put the new system in place, but we hope the clock will be chiming once again by the end of January.

On this good note, I would like to thank everyone who has helped us out this year, and I would like to personally wish you all a very Merry Christmas.
