

#### **NEWS FROM THE TRUST**

It's always difficult to start this piece as most of the 'News' is centred around the Community Centre. So, I will start there. We are obviously relying heavily on those booking for either one event right up to those booking more frequently.

The layout of the building does pose problems at times. The Hall has always been where most of the bookings are, and that goes right back to when the Church were doing this. It seems that our Hall is the largest in Berwick, and it also has good access. We try to ensure that Middle Street doesn't get too congested with parked cars. That's not always possible and we hope our neighbours are not to put out!

Just to give you an idea who books with us, in the Hall the more frequent users are Zumba, Beavers, Cubs, Guides, Little Lights, Wee Bairns Yoga, Tai Chi and the Waypoint Church. The front of the building hosts on a regular basis Knit & Natter, Berwick Arts Choir and Waypoint Church. From August onwards the Spittal Variety Group uses the front rooms for rehearsals several times a week up to their annual pantomime. There are quite a few groups that use the building less frequently. Spittal 1st School, funeral services and private functions being some of them. The problems that arise are making sure, for instance, that a group using the Hall do not drown out an event going on in the front rooms.

Whether the group is being run as a business, or is being run by volunteers, we have met some very dedicated people. And we hope to meet more in the future!

On a personal note, I have always hoped that we would eventually have a Community Café in the front room off of Main Street, which we have kept its original name the Aidan Room. To start with, this does necessarily have to be open every day of the week. We would probably start off with two days a week and build it up from there. When people can walk in off the street, met up with others, have a cup of tea or coffee, or simply sitting and enjoy your brew whilst reading a book from our extensive library, then it becomes a Community Centre!





## TWEED AND COAST NATURE TRAIL

Join Connecting Threads to paddle along the Tweed Estuary by canoe, cleaning the river as we go.

As part of the Great Borders River Clean we are looking for keen river volunteers to help clean the Tweed as it makes it way to the sea.

Outdoor instructor Ollie Jay will lead an expedition by canoe, helping to us get to harder to reach places on the wide river estuary. Other groups will continue on foot, targeting the river bank. Artist Chloë Smith will lead a creative zine making workshop, helping participants to explore the wildlife of the river.

Lunch, litter picking equipment, canoes and PPE provided – but please do bring a picker and gloves if you already have some!

Canoe spaces are limited and must be booked in advance. Each canoe can hold two people and at east one person per boat must have previous experience and be a competent paddler. Buoyancy aids will be provided.

All volunteers must dress appropriately for the outdoors, and must wear sturdy, thick soled footwear. Canoeists should wear clothes they are happy with getting muddy and wet, and are recommended to bring a change of clothing. The river estuary is an unpredictable ecosystem and weather can change rapidly. Be prepared for anything!

Volunteer travel bursary available for those travelling from outside the Berwick area.

Children under 16 must be accompanied by an adult. Canoe activity suitable for ages 10+ if accompanied by an experienced adult.

Please book in advance to let us know you are coming, any dietary requirements and if you require support with travel costs.

The aim of this event is to clean the Tweed, creatively highlight the importance of tackling pollution, celebrate this incredible river and what it means to us and the wildlife that calls it home.
