Lifeboat Day is on Sunday August 4th and will be a bigger event this year with music and more stalls and entertainment.

On 14th June the **RNLI 200th Anniversary Scroll** came to our station. It bears the RNLI pledge and it's travelling round the British Isles visiting every station, shop and fundraising group and it's signed at every venue.

Ford, the car manufacturer, donated an E-Transit van for the journey and one person is driving the entire trip.

The scroll started its journey on Monday 4th March 2024 at the Service of Thanksgiving in Westminster Abbey, this was our charities official 200th Birthday.

It will take seven months for the scroll to visit 240 locations and will finish its journey in

October at Douglas on the Isle of Man, which was home to the RNLI's founder Sir William Hillary.

The scroll was signed by Mau Watkins, Gareth Patterson and Kevin Knox on behalf of all at our station.


The Guides enjoyed doing the litter pick, finding it rewarding to see the areas litter free and helping to make a difference in the local area.




SPOT THE DIFFERENCE



SPITTAL POST OFFICES

1833 a Spittal postmark was used1841 an undated hand stamp was issued

31 Main Street

1852 the Board of Health map shows this property as a Post Office It sold the 'Penny Red' stamp



- 1851, 1861, 1871 census, Front Street (Main Street) had a Post Office here run by the Davidsons
- 1878 Spittal Post Office became an office for Savings Bank & Money Order Telegraph
- 1881 Mr Davidson, age 71, died at the PO

66 Main Street

1891 census, Agnes Hall age 26 postmistress1894 Kelly's directory, Agnes Hall postmistress

17 Main Street

- 1903 Slater's Directory, Agnes Hownam, bookseller, stationer, newsagent & sub postmistress, she took in lodgers
- 1907 Agnes Hownam resigns

1911 census, Mr. S Brigham, Druggist and sub postmaster. A postcard has this on the back:

S. Brigham, Border Drug Stores, Spittal

- 1914 Kelly's directory, Sibbit Brigham, druggist and post office
 1921 S Brigham is an agent for rat killer
 1924 Sibbit Brigham died aged 70
- 1928 Anecdotal: "My uncle, Willie Ford, was the postmaster at number 17"

62 Main Street 1935 directory, William Ford, postmaster

66 Main Street (for the second time)

1939 registry, William Ford, sub postmaster Carved lettering, POST OFFICE, is just visible above the door, but from which date? 1953 a newspaper article names William Ford at the

Post Office in Spittal. He would have been selling 1935 commemorative 1/2d stamps for George V's Silver Jubilee

74 Main Street

STREET,

SPITTAL, BERWICK-ON-TWEED.

Confectionery,

Cigarettes,

Tobacco.

2005 6th June, the Post Office closed when the postmaster was Neil Ruddick and his assistant was June McRoy

2024 the post box remains at this last location
