The Sailing Club has worked hard to landscape the dunes, either side of the slipway, to create three very distinct crossing points. There has been an attempt to create protected pockets, along the sides of the slipway, in order to allow the Marram Grass to flourish.

The Sailing Club is appealing to local walkers to stay on the clear pathways to avoid trampling and damaging the general areas.



SRI LANKA AND ITS CONNECTION WITH SPITTAL

Twenty years ago, this coming December, the Boxing Day tsunami devastated communities along the coast of the Indian Ocean. Over 200,000 people were killed ,including 131 in the small Sri Lankan town of Weligama. Soon after, several Spittal residents decided to help in the recovery of the Weligama community. Fund raising events were held at what was St Pauls Church to provide money for school equipment.

Over £2,500 was realised in Spittal to fund a well at the small village of Thelulla Janapadaya, which was opened on February 2nd, 2014, the villagers are able to access water for drinking and washing, while previously they had to walk four miles to obtain water. The well bears the inscription 'donated by the community of Spittal. In times of drought the villagers use the water for irrigation.

For over ten years many children from single parent homes have been provided with monthly 'food allowances' of 5,000 rupees (£12). In 2023, £18,200 was forwarded to children in need in Weligama.

Much of this amount was from Spittal residents, including three former Mayors, all living in Main Street!!

At the moment five University students from single parent families are being assisted with their daily living expenses (totalling £3,200 in 2023). Since 2017 five students have been able to graduate thanks to the help of over sixty supporters from Spittal and nearby communities.
